Dear Bethesda Church Family:

Much can be said of a church that attracts and retains three retired pastors. We have found Bethesda to be one of the best examples of what a church is supposed to be. Many reasons could be given for why this is the case for Bethesda. Our church has certain key characteristics that generate loyalty. Bethesda shows great concern for each and every person, making sure no one is left wondering if anyone cares. Our church also demonstrates a never-wavering commitment to not only the worship of our Lord, but also to putting our Christianity to the test as we strive together to be faithful in every area of our discipleship.

Anyone would be blessed to be a part of this most important work. In the process of service, Bethesda also clearly demonstrates a deep desire to grow in the Christian faith and in our understanding of our salvation through Christ.

As a part of our relationship with Bethesda and our admiration for everyone who makes sure our ministry is powerful, Spirit-led, and life changing, the four clergy of this church would like to express our opinions about the discernment of whether or not Bethesda should separate from the United Methodist Church. We feel strongly that Bethesda should remain in the United Methodist Church.

As your friends and your clergy, we know that you have and will continue to prayerfully consider the very important decision of whether or not to separate from the United Methodist Church. We do hope that you will consider these points of concern:

We should be mindful of our church body as a whole, including those families who have gay children, relatives, and friends. A vote to separate will damage and affect relationships within our church family, which goes against Bethesda's core value of being a close family. Also it would make our church less attractive to prospective members who have more openly accepting views toward diverse groups of people. Are we being the church that God has called us to be?

The connectional system of the United Methodist Church supports vital ministries, such as Epworth Children's Home, Salkehatchie Summer Service, UMCOR, UMVIM, and others, and is dependent upon the local congregations for providing support to maintain these important connections across the globe. By separating, we might be affecting the opportunities provided by these ministries and ultimately, changing the course of the lives of thousands of God's people. Are we supporting the ministries that God is calling us to help?

Withdrawal will for many congregations entail complicated and expensive struggles to take their worship and educational facilities with them. Willfully using these large amounts of money to purchase existing buildings, solely for the means of separating from the denomination, would be considered poor stewardship of our church funds, taking away from the resources needed by important ministries. Are we using our money for the purposes God intends?

It is reasonable to ask if disaffiliation would not be breaking faith with the saints who have gone before us, who labored, sacrificed, and prayed that Bethesda might be a shining light in the community. Are we living into God's purpose for our church in our community?

It raises the question about the church cemetery in which many members and supporters of the church from many decades past are buried. It is also the final resting place for family members of some in our present congregation. Without the continued connection of the United Methodist Church, there will be no guarantee that the cemetery will be maintained and connected with this congregation for decades to come. Any changes to church property opens Bethesda to the possibility of other future changes, which may be out of our control. Are we willing to risk losing this foundational piece of our heritage?

Withdrawal will result in Bethesda no longer having an appointed pastor. A search committee would have to be used to find a pastor to serve, and with less people going into the ministry in recent years, this could be a significant challenge. Are we willing to risk not having a pastor or being able to find one?

There is also the issue of exclusion. If we give the impression of judging others who wish to worship and work with us in the name of Jesus, what does that say about our personal witness to them?

Jesus understood the dilemmas of the future of Christianity. It is of great significance that He chose to pray for this one issue of division right before his betrayal and crucifixion. These words speak clearly of His desire for all Christians of all times.

'I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me.' John 17: 20-23

God bless and guide each and every one of you in making this important decision.


Super Adult Ministry sponsors exercise every Tuesday & Thursday morning at 9am in the Class Rm 207/208.






