



#### Hi Everyone,

I hope you all are doing well. I feel like time is flying. I can't believe the first quarter of this year has already passed and we are already finished with our first term of school. Overall, we are doing well. Right now, we have 2 weeks off of school. Just before the break, our students were able to go on a field trip and they loved it! The preschoolers visited Giraffe Center and a small amusement park. Most kids were excited to feed the giraffes, but a few were scared. They loved playing on all the rides and bouncy houses at the amusement park. The older kids (Grades 1-4), visited Wilson Airport and the same amusement park. The kids loved looking at the airplanes and watching them take off and land. They were taught about the different jobs that people do at the airport such as pilots and aeronautical engineers. I have included some pictures from the trip below. I love taking the students for field trips because so many students never leave our small town. They are always amazed by the big skyscrapers and billboards in Nairobi. It is an eye opening experience for them.

Our special needs program is growing a lot and the feedback that I am hearing from parents is amazing. We have had parents travel for an hour to enquire about our special needs program because there are very few schools in Kenya that will accept students with special needs. I recently had a parent teacher conference with a parent of a child with autism. He is in kindergarten and has been at Comet for around 6 months. She was so happy with her son's progress and the inclusive environment at Comet. She said that she had tried to take him to so many other schools, but the teachers were not trained in how to deal with kids with special needs, so the environment was not inclusive. When he was in other schools, he would always cry on the way to school, but now at Comet he is excited to come to school and has made many friends. On the day of our meeting, his mom was planning on dismissing him early after the meeting, but he didn't want to go with her. He wanted to stay in school. His mom said that even their neighbors have noticed a positive change in him. This conversation made me really appreciate how great our teachers are at Comet. They have really adapted to teaching students with special needs and have fully integrated them with love into our school. I couldn't be prouder of our teachers!

My kids are doing well and enjoying the short break from school. Angel and Wambui are at a Taekwondo camp. This is their first time going to an overnight camp, so they were really excited but also a little bit nervous. Val was really upset that she couldn't join them, but she has enjoyed having my undivided attention while the big kids were away. Angel, Wambui and Val all did well in their end of term assessments. They are meeting or exceeding expectations in all subjects, so I'm very proud of them.

Like the majority of the world, inflation has really hit Kenya. The price of gas has increased significantly which is increasing the cost of everything from food to clothes. The price of electricity has tripled in the last two years. These things are really influencing my monthly expenditures. Because of inflation and adding Wambui to my family, in the past year my monthly expenditures have almost doubled despite trying my best to be frugal. As most of you know, I am a volunteer, so I rely on donations and supporters to provide for me and my kids. I am so grateful for all of you that have supported me over the years and especially grateful to my home church, Bethesda United Methodist because they support me every month without fail. Previously, their support was enough for me and my family, but with the rising costs I am struggling to make ends meet. I really hate asking for money, but it is a necessary part of being a volunteer with three kids to provide for. Anything you can give would be so appreciated- whether you can give a one time gift or commit to monthly support. (Donation methods are listed at the bottom.)

In one of my previous emails, I mentioned that we are focusing on prayer this year, and I have been able to feel the power of everyone's prayers. We have seen amazing blessings at Comet and none of that would be possible without your prayers and God! Please pray especially for all of our scholarship students while we are on this two week break. Pray that they will have enough food to eat until we go back to school. Please pray for our teachers that they may rest over this break and that when they come back to school they will be re-energized and motivated to educate our students. We are in the process of hiring some new teachers, so please pray that we can find the perfect candidate for the job. Pray for guidance for all of us that are in the administrative level at Comet. Prayer can really move mountains!

Thank you all so much for your prayers and support! We could not do this without each of you!






