


The Mission of Bethesda United Methodist Church By God's grace, to make disciples of Jesus Christ through a loving community of faith and service.

From the Church Council

The Bethesda UMC Board of Stewards met on Sept 19, 2023. The following actions were taken:

Following several resignations, and with subsequent recommendations from the Nominations and Leadership Development Committee, a new board was elected with all positions filled. All board members are enthusiastic about the future development opportunities that await us.

The first action taken by the new board was to amend its name to the Bethesda United Methodist Church Council (BCC). This change is consistent with the Book of Discipline paragraph 252.

Its duties and functions will remain the same as in the past.

A motion was made that Bethesda UMC end its period or discernment, related to a possible separation as described in paragraph 2549 of the Book of Discipline, and to withdraw from the separation process. The vote to do this was 12 yes and 0 no. This decision has been communicated to the District Superintendent, Rev Steve Patterson. Rev Patterson has subsequently removed Bethesda from the Separation/Closure process.

There will be no further votes nor other actions or considerations related to a separation.

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the BCC will be on the third Tuesday in November, Nov 21, at 7 p.m. in the Education Building, Room 214/215.

Sunday School is great time for sharing and learning for all age groups! We have classes open every Sunday morning. Classes meet in the Education Building. Adult classes meet on the top floor, while Preschool to High School meet on the bottom floor. Nursery is provided for children age 2 and under.

Preschool K3 & K4 / K - 2nd Grade / 3rd - 5th Grade / Middle & High School (Rm 107)

Adventures In Faith Class is a Bible-based and issues-oriented class with focused discussion and application of the Word to everyday living. Service and prayer are central to this group. Class members are at or near retirement age. (Room 213)

Common Ground College & Career Class The Common Ground College & Career Sunday School Class meets during college semester breaks. Crosstalk Class is discussion-based with focus on current issues using biblical guidance. Members range from the age of 30+ to the "Finish Line" and work together in many different activities in the church. (Room 216)




















The United Methodist Men plan to meet Monday, October 2 at 7pm in the dining room of the Family Life Center.

From the Finance Committee

Dear Congregation of Bethesda United Methodist Church,

We want to provide an update from the September 19th meetings of the Finance Committee and the Church Council.

The Finance Committee reported that our church has the resources to carry us through the coming months despite the recent decrease in general offerings. The Committee commenced observing these trends months ago,

and began measures that would prepare our church for contingencies.

Currently, tithes and gifts remain lower than anticipated at the beginning of 2023. Again, let us stress that we are in a sound financial position, however, more careful stewardship is needed for a while. We are starting the budgeting process for 2024, and our review method will emphasize "needs" versus "wants". Most of us have to do this when preparing our own family budgets. We seek your help and want you to have a voice. There are suggestion forms in the Narthex, so anyone who has money-saving ideas for the Finance Committee can write in their ideas for us to review and implement. It isn't required, but feel free to add your name and phone number in case we have questions.

Our focus is on Christ and His Church. Our immediate goal is to meet the most basic of needs and maintain our ministries and missions.

We all need to tithe and give freely at this time. As we move forward together, Bethesda UMC will continue to be a bright light in our community and our world as we "Love. Love. Listen. Serve"!


